


Cardiac Causes of Syncope

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- 1. Definition:
 - Sudden loss of consciousness due to hypoperfusion of the brain
 - Absence of other causes: seizure, hypoxia, hypoglycemia, intoxication etc.



- 2. Workup: be wary of over-testing
 - EKG: look for evidence of unhealthy conduction system: prolonged PR interval, LBBB, RBBB, slow sinus rate etc.
 - In select patients:
 - Carotid ultrasound (to work up transient ischemic)
 - o Orthostatic vital signs
 - Telemetry/heart monitors
 - Who is high risk and/or deserves inpatient admission
 - $\circ \quad \text{Vasovagal} \rightarrow \text{usually no need to admit}$
 - \circ $\,$ Cardiac cause that may recrudesce \rightarrow warrants admission

3. Management:

- Immediate measures:
 - Lie down + elevate lower limbs
 - Obtain vital signs, history
- Indications for AICD (automatic implantable cardioverter defibrillator)
 - o Survives ventricular Tachycardia, Ventricular fibrillation
 - o High risk: very low EF especially in context of ischemia
